THE WALKING WINDSOR LAW DEAD

A plan for escaping and surviving the Windsor Law zombie apocalypse

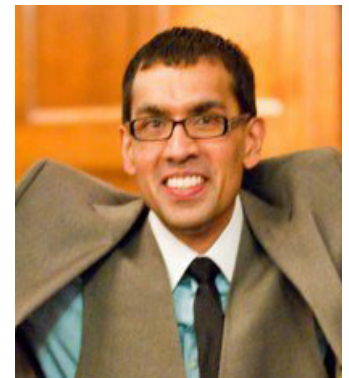
Windsor Law seeks Criminal Law Professor

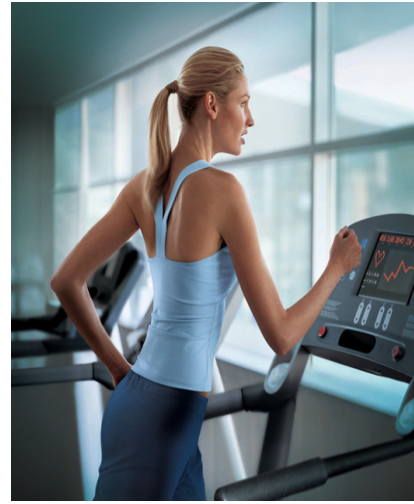

Three events in one proves to be a big success for V-day!



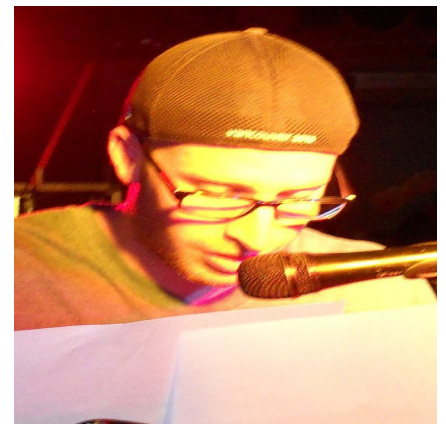
"Don't hate the playa, hate the game" Morgan Koch

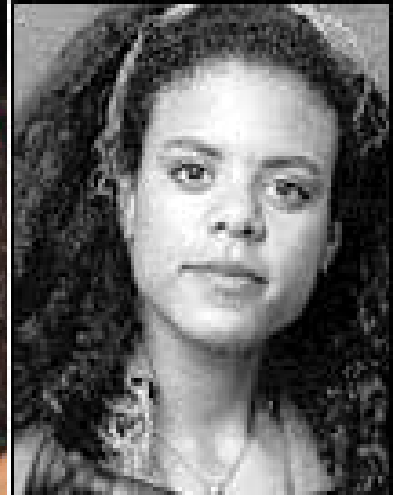

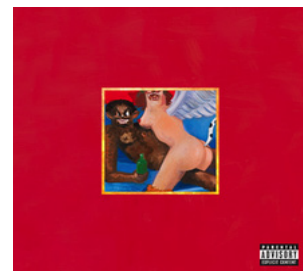

PRO: A lifetime of defending guilty people will weaken your conscience to the point where you can finally take it around back and shoot it.

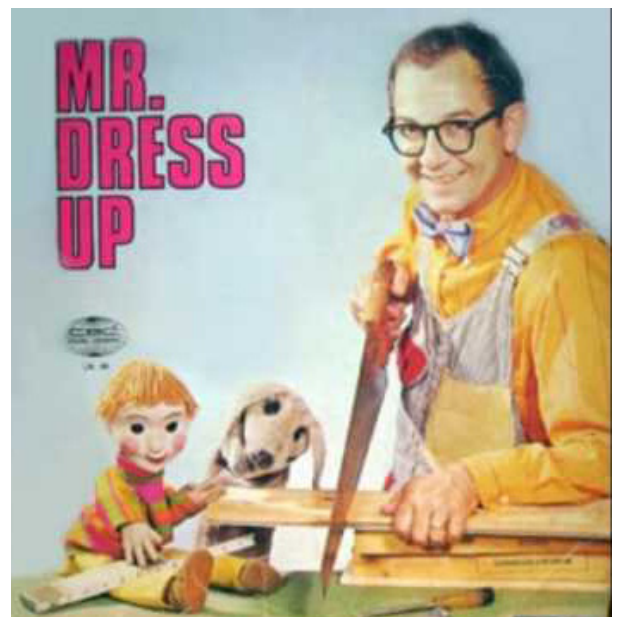
CON: All the fun you had with the hypos in criminal exams will set you up for disappointment when none of your cases ever come close to the complexity and morbidness of a Tano exam.

PRO: The Criminal Code is excellent toilet reading and it comes in handy when you run out of toilet paper.

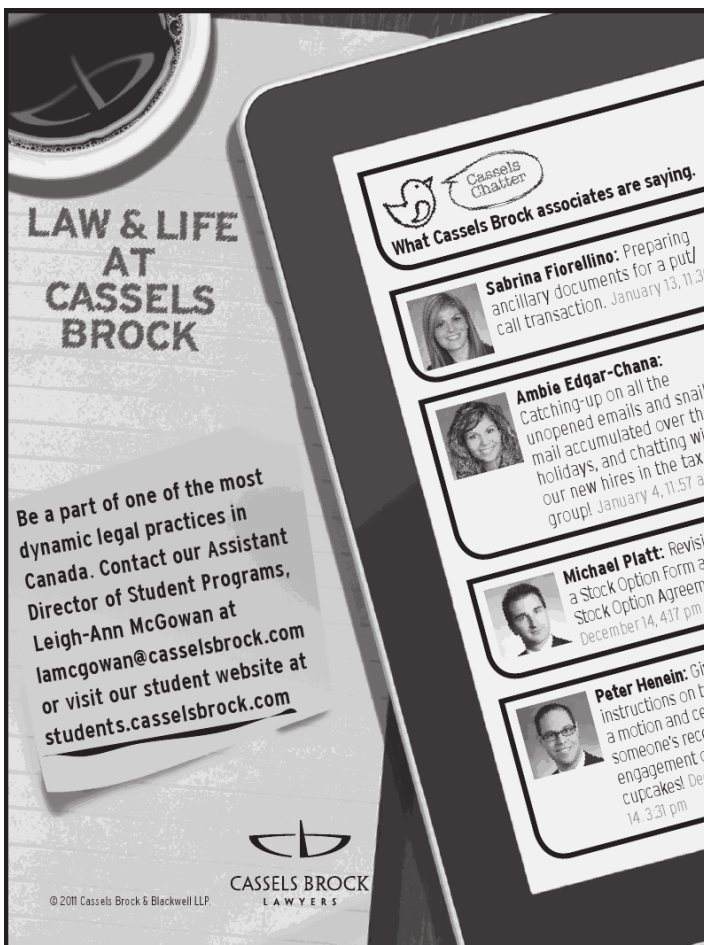
CON: Some criminal lawyers have managed to reduce police to tears during cross-examinations. Do you really think it would be fun to make a cop appear weak in public?
