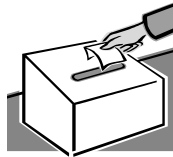

Windsor Law Events

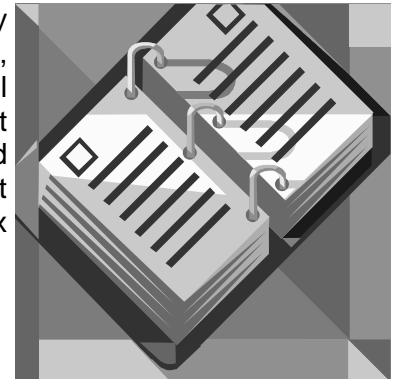
One of the newest initiatives at Windsor Law is an events calendar designed to raise the profile of our student and faculty driven events throughout the year.
